




ADVOCACY

EAT South Shore

We saw an overall growth over the majority of our social media platforms, averaging 72% for EAT South Shore.

EAT South Shore, our restaurant initiative that we launched in 2018, shared important and timely information for restaurants and breweries. During the stay-at-home advisory, we shared updates from both members and non-members, helping out 138 establishments and equaling over 2,000 updates.

For our member restaurants and breweries, we **shared 1,888** member posts to our Stories; mentioned or shared our members **404** times on Instagram and **677** on Facebook.

We also welcomed **7 new member** restaurants in 2020!





New Program!

Open to all to attend, we used this program to raise awareness for one of the hardest hit industries during COVID-19. Launched in the Fall, we featured two restaurants, providing not only a platform for attendees to get to know our local chefs but also an opportunity to show monetary support to those featured. Proceeds went directly to the restaurant to purchase a \$10 gift card which was returned to the attendee for them to use at a future date!

Businesses are drawn to communities where there is interesting, diverse, and attractive places for their talent to live and work. That is why our 2030 plan includes initiatives focused on creating a strong environment to grow existing businesses and attract new businesses.

Our 2020 highlights:

- Housing Committee launched municipal engagement program
- Launch of Transportation Advisory Group
- Advocated to preserve the ferry and bus services (and it worked!)
- Held a Housing on the South Shore 3-part series with over 225 attendees
- Held focus groups on pandemic impact across sectors of housing industry
- Supported various development projects across the region
- Teamed up with Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC) to study how limits on water and wastewater capacity may be preventing economic opportunity in the area



SUPPORTING LOCAL.



Soon after the Governor issued the "stay-at-home" order in March, the South Shore Chamber quickly organized the first of several key conference calls with the heads of ALL local Chambers across the South Shore region. This was an important time for all Chambers to check-in with each other, share fast-evolving information, voice frustrations, and to begin exploring new "best practices".

All local Chamber affiliates quickly began hosting Zoom meetings between the business community and state and local government. In addition to these regular updates:

- **Braintree Chamber** launched a Facebook page and a blog. These efforts saw a 99% increase in website visitors.
- Rockland Chamber Chair, Jeff Phelps, attended a ribbon cutting at the newly renovated Dunkin Donuts located on Hingham Street in Rockland
- Weymouth Chamber held a "Music Trivia Night" with Mayor Hedlund
- SSYP's held a successfully socially distanced Golf Tournament raising funds towards their 2021
 Grant
- Weymouth Chamber Chair, Dennis Keohane, also safely attended a ribbon cutting ceremony for a redevelopment project at 1055 Main Street which will see mixed use redevelopment project on the site that housed the Colonial Bowl and John's Liquors
- Hanover Chamber has new officers: President Erin Richardson, VP Scott Clifford, and Treasurer Dan Berry
- Marshfield Chamber raised 35K for the Marshfield Community Fund
- Marshfield welcomed 25 new members and hosted 28 Zoom events / 8 specifically COVID-19 related
- Executive Director appointed to Marshfield's "COVID-19 Reopening Task Force"
